came the plaintiff his attorney and the defendant the defendant called some into the court
considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the sum of One
hundred fifty dollars with legal interest thereon from the 1st of January 1864 till paid and
his costs by him and the sheriff expended and it is ordered that the Officer who levies the said
attachment make sale of the goods & chattels attached or so much thereof as may be sufficient
and out of the moneys arising therefrom pay satisfaction to the plaintiff and the
surplus if any return to the defendant and return an account of such sale to the Court
