Deed of bargain & sale dated April 30th 1866 from W. H. Butler Commissioner to John
 D. Harrison conveying real estate, was admitted to record June 10th 1867

Ordered that the account of Marshall Hutchison jailer of Norfolk County, which just
 has been audited as the jail of Southampton County, amounting to thirty nine dollars be certified to the
 Auditor of Public accounts for his examination & payment.
