The Commissioner appointed to let out the business of a ferry at Ellinore this day made report and the Court upon consideration with ratify and confirms the indenture.

The annual report of the Overseer of the Poor was this day returned and ordered to be filed and copy thereof to be certified to the Auditor.

On the petition of Am. & Morris, Anna Maria, Ann Morris George Morris, Louisa Morris Goldthwait also filed under the Act of Assembly passed February 11th 1867 intituled "an act to amend the 2^d section of the act to say the collection of debts for a limited period passed March 2^d 1866." It is ordered that a Commissioner of the Court enquire and report whether any of the above named parties is defendant for or defendant upon the interest in or principal of any debt the collection of which is stayed by the act aforesaid and if so what amount is necessary for the defendant of the petitioners or any one or more of them for one year, let and each debtor of them be more than one, shall pay, specifying the whole upon whom ratably, and whether the sum so required shall be paid in instalments or at once and of no instalments when the same shall be paid.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the County to the next Court to lay the County levy to debtors for the next twelve months.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the Court in Course.
