

The last Will and Testament of Rebecca Stephenson dec^d was proved according to law by the oaths of Franklin Vick & R. C. Edwards, the subscribing witnesses thereto, & it is ordered to be recorded. And on the return of Alfred T. & William W. Stephenson her sons (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted them for drawing of the said Will in due form. It being declared on oath that the estate real & personal of the said Rebecca Stephenson does not exceed in value the sum of One thousand dollars.

Ordered that M. D. Butler, Franklin Vick, D. L. Dike & James Drury, or any three of them being first duly sworn for the purpose, do deliver up all the goods or chattels of Rebecca Stephenson dec^d and return the same under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

Ordered that Stephen Hines, J. R. Bennett & John L. Carter being first duly sworn for the purpose, do deliver up all the goods or chattels of Wiley Law dec^d and return the same under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

The last Will Testament of Samuel Denson dec^d was proved by the oaths of Arrington Gardner one of the subscribing witnesses thereto & John Jeyner the other subscribing witness being dead, the said Arrington Gardner being sworn declares that the said John Jeyner himself signed their names as witnesses to the said Will in the presence and at the request of the testator of the testator and in the presence of each other. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Will be recorded. And on the return of Edwards J. Jeyner who made oath and together with Arrington Gardner his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned according to law. Certificate is granted him for drawing of a declaration as the estate of the said Samuel Denson dec^d with his will expressed annexed in due form. It being declared on oath that the estate real & personal of the said Samuel Denson dec^d does not exceed in value the sum of One thousand dollars.

The Court with advice Mary A. Rollings guardian to Louisa, Margaret, Sarah, John & William Rollings orphans of Patrick H. Rollings dec^d and thereupon the said Mary A. Rollings with W. H. Cobb & W. H. Perkins her securities, who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One hundred and fifty dollars conditioned according to law. It being declared on oath that the estate of the said Ward, real & personal, does not exceed in value the sum of One thousand dollars.

On the motion of Mary A. Rollings guardian of the orphans of Patrick H. Rollings dec^d she is allowed to return the sum of One hundred and ten dollars out of the principal of the said estate in his hands for the support of said orphans during the death of their father.

David Cobb is appointed surveyor of the new road leading from Jerusalem to the lower Down, by said Cobb, and it is ordered that he with the male laboring fit to labor on his lands, R. J. Darden the male laboring fit to labor on his lands, Henry Whitehead, W. Whitehead, Robert Whitehead, John Ross, J. B. Barkham, C. B. Little and Oscar Kitchen & all the male laboring fit to labor on their lands & each of their lands keep the said road in good repair.

Jefferson J. Woodard is appointed surveyor of the road from Hailys bridge road to Purville Bridge in the name of Andrew J. Hume & it is ordered that the usual hands work thereon.

Ordered that John Taylor, Sanby Smith & Henry Darden, do work on the road which joins H. Darden is surveyor.
