

Upon the petition of James H. Barnes Guardian of Elizabeth H. Moore & Hannah Moore this day filed. It is ordered that a Commission in Chancery of the Court be made and return to the Court whether the said Words Elizabeth H. & Hannah Moore are defendants for a support when the interest in or principal of any debt. The collection of which interest or principal is stayed by the act of assembly passed February 11 1867. entitled an act to amend the 5th Section of the act relating to the collection of debts for a limited period. passed March 2^d 1866, and also what amount is necessary for the support of the said Words for one year. what amount each debtor of them be more than one shall pay, apportion the same ratably, and whether the same so apportioned shall be paid in instalments or at one time and if in instalments when the same shall be paid.

On the motion of Joseph S. Sawyer who produced to the Court proof of his ordination and of his being in regular communion with the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church in America and entered into bonds with security in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned according to law it is ordered that he be authorized to celebrate the rites of marriage.

Caleb Everett appears over of the age of fourteen years with the approbation of the Court made cheer of Benjamin B. Bryant for his guardians whom upon he together with Richard Bryant & Charles O. Bryant his creditors who justified on oath as to their sufficiency, whereunto acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned according to law it being declared on oath that the estate real & personal of the said Caleb Everett does not exceed in value the sum of \$2000.

The Court take notice John S. Kendrick Guardian of his infant children Mary E. for D. and Andrew Kendrick and thereupon he together with Rev. B. Kendrick his surety who justified on oath as to his sufficiency entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned according to law. It being declared on oath the estate of the said words does not exceed in value \$1000.

Samuel Hille Sheriff of this County, this day returned to the Court three several lists of arrears due on warrants to \$37.25 another to \$62.40 & another to \$3.04. & another to \$12.80 which lists were verified by the oath of the Deputy Sheriff and duly certified by the Comptroller of the Revenue and having been reviewed by the Court and the Court being satisfied of the correctness of the same and also satisfied that copies of said lists were posted up at the Court house door of this County on a Court day during the next preceding Term to this. It is ordered that copies of said lists be certified to the first Auditor.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Court tomorrow.
