

Upon the petition of James H. Barnes, guardian of Elizabeth Mathews & Hamill, done this day filed. It is ordered that a Commissioner or Chancery of this Court ascertain and report to the Court whether the said Wm. Elizabeth H. & Hamill above are dependent for a sufficient sum to satisfy a Principal of any debt, the collection of which interest or principal delayed by the act of Assembly passed February 11, 1867, entitled an act to amend the 5<sup>th</sup> Section of Act to limit the collection of debts for a limited period, passed March 27, 1866, and for what amount necessary for the support of the said Wm. Elizabeth for one year, what amount each debt of them be more than one shall pay, offering the same orally, and whether the same so offered shall be paid on instalments or at once and if in instalments when the same shall be paid.

On the motion of Joseph J. Lawyer who produced to the Court proof of his ordination and of his being in regular communion with the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church in America and entered into bond with Security in the penalty of \$1000 conditioned according to law it is ordered that he be authorized to celebrate the rites of marriage.

Gold Everett aforesaid over the age of fourteen years with the approbation of the Court made choice of Benjamin Bryant for his Guardian whereupon he together with Richard L. Bryant & Charles E. Bryant his executors, who justify on oath as to their sufficiency, doth enter into acknowledgement, bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned according to law. It being declared on oath that the said Gold Everett doth not exceed in value the sum of \$2,000 —

The Court doth adjudge John D. Hinckley, guardian of his infant children Mary E. & S. and Antoinette Hinckley and whereupon he together with Ben. B. Hinckley his Deputy doth justify on oath as to his sufficiency entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One thousand dollars conditioned according to law. It being declared on oath the value of the said ward doth not exceed in value \$800 —

Samuel Hales Sheriff of this County, this day returned to the Court three several lists of inmates one amounting to \$37.24 another to \$62.40 & another to \$3.04. & another to \$12.80 which lists were verified by the order of the Deputy Sheriff and duly certified by the Comptroller of the Revenue and Clerk of Court to the Court and the Court being satisfied of the correctness of the same, and also satisfied that copies of said lists were posted up at the front house door of this County on Court day during the most preceding Term, to this it is ordered that copies of said lists be certified to the first Auditor —

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Court in Session.
