

On the petition of Peter F. Harris, Mary J. Harris yet with Harris for money by their  
 Guardian George A. Hargraves this day filed.  
 This cause this day came on to be heard on the petition of Peter F. Harris J. yet with  
 Harris by their guardian Geo. A. Hargraves and was argued by Leonard. On consideration  
 whereof the Court doth adjudge order and decree that one of the Commissioners of the Court  
 after having viewed due and reasonable notice to the debtors named in the said petition of the  
 same and place of stating their account, proceed to ascertain 1<sup>st</sup> whether the petitioners  
 Peter F. Harris J. yet with Harris, are dependant for support upon the said principal and  
 interest of the said debts - 2<sup>d</sup> If so, what amount is necessary for their support for the  
 year 1867, and expensing the same ratably upon the said debts, stating how  
 much each one shall pay, whether the same shall be paid in installments, at what times  
 and report the same to the Court, together with any matters deemed pertinent by himself  
 or which may be so required to be stated by any of the parties interested.

Benjamin Knight who is charged or called by Mary Ann Summers a white English woman  
 of this County with being the father of a bastard child whom she was delivered on the 12<sup>th</sup> July  
 1867, this day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered at the last Term - and  
 thereupon the said Mary Ann Summers Benjamin Knight and Lewis their witnesses were  
 sworn and examined - The Court after hearing the testimony is of opinion that the said  
 Benjamin Knight is not the father of this said bastard child. It is therefore the opinion of the Court  
 and accordingly ordered that the charge aforesaid be dismissed.

Ordered that W. K. Briggs, R. J. Darden & J. D. Probert be appointed Commissioners to  
 carry into effect the recommendations contained in the report of the inspectors of jail ap-  
 pointed at the Circuit Court last held for this County, in such manner as they may think  
 best for the County by letting out by contract or otherwise.

The Court doth assign George Griffin guardian to his infant children Anna Frank  
 Benjamin William Griffin and thereupon the said George Griffin together with Wade  
 Allford his security, who justified on oath as to his sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged  
 a bond in the penalty of forty dollars conditioned according to law.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs of the embankment and bridge known as  
 Branches bridge over Duck Swamp this day made their report which the Court approved.

The Commissioners appointed to let the repairs or rebuilding of the bridge over Flat Swamp  
 on the Bayport road near R. H. Thomas this day made their report which the Court approved.
