" It appearing to the Court that Jas. D. Vick a Comptroller of the Treasury has leave on his goods and chattels as the property of John D. A. Barkard to satisfy sundry executions which he holds in trust one in favor of William Briggs, one in favor of Isabell & Abraham one in favor of H. J. Howard, one in favor of R. E. Gardin, one in favor of David Branch, one in favor of Hiley Vick, one in favor of Amble Dillard & Co, one in favor of C. W. Richardson, one in favor of Jerry Jones, one in favor of J. G. Little, one in favor of Mills Gardin. And it also appearing that James Holmes, also claims the said property, has executed a suspending Bank note Securing, all the appurtenances of the Plaintiff in such execution. It is ordered that the Clerk James Holmes, be summoned this first day of the next term to try the right to the property laid in, and it is further ordered, that James D. Vick make sale according to law, of the articles, twenty Hhds. twenty barrels of corn, and fodder, part of the goods and chattels laid in, that the said sale be on a credit of thirty days, that the officer take tenth and good security, for the purchased money, and send the same to the order of this Court.

Ordered that W. Lewis, John Williams, Silas S. Larmer and Dr. L. A. Drury, or any three of them, let to the lowest bidder the repair of ^{the} stone bridge over the stone creek, during the same when completed and made up to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until Court in Session.
