

On the petition of Nancy E. Briggs & Caroline M. Briggs. -

This day this cause came on again to be heard in the papers formerly made, and the report of a Commissioner of this Court of the said, to which no exceptions had been filed, and was argued by counsel, on the consideration whereof the Court doth adjudged, Ordon and decreed, that the said report be confirmed, Thomas acting guardian of Nancy E. Briggs & Caroline M. Briggs the sum of \$34.74 cts on bond, That Joseph C. Bland and Joshua D. Blank pay to the said the sum of \$11.42 cts on bond, That James W. Foster pay to the said the sum of \$58.42 cts on bond, That Samuel Beale & Charles Beale pay to the said the sum of \$10.00 cts on bond, That Samuel Bryants pay to the said the sum of \$77.54 cts on bond, That John M. Conley and Joseph H. Beauchamp, pay to the said the sum of \$150.17 cts on bond, That John H. Bishop pay to the said the sum of \$28.42 on bond, That Nathaniel F. Pearson and William F. Francis pay to the said the sum of \$54.80 cts on bond, That George W. Musgrave pay to the said the sum of \$7.01 on bond, That John Loring pay to the said the sum of \$7.43 cts on bond, That Joshua D. Bland pay to the said the sum of \$9.93 cts on bond, That Samuel B. Murrell pay to the said the sum of \$5 on bond, That Wm B. Ford pay to the said the sum of \$5.04 cts on bond, That Nathaniel F. Pearson pay to the said the sum of \$10.55 cts on bond, That Thomas B. Powell pay to the said the sum of \$5.85 cts on bond, That James S. Westbrook and Littleton G. Powell pay to the said the sum of \$5.00 cts on bond. And the Court doth further adjudged, Ordon and decreed, that debtors aforesaid pay to the Plaintiffs their costs by them in this suit expended.

A Writing bearing date 23<sup>rd</sup> March 1865 purporting to be the last will & testament of John Campbell was produced to the Court and returned till the next Term, and it is ordered that the Sheriff shall be commanded the next Term of this Court to prove the same.

On the motion of Rebecca Bland against Davis Bessett & Thomas L. Poff. This day came & plaintiff by her attorney and it appearing to the Court that the Defendants have had legal notice of this motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the Defendants twenty one dollars in the legal interest thereon from this 16<sup>th</sup> day of September 1867 till paid being a sum equal to the interest for one year on the sum of \$350. principal due by the Defendants to the Plaintiff by bond dated 19<sup>th</sup> January 1866 and payable on demand, and on which judgment was obtained at November Term 1866 of Southampton Circuit Court. And also that the Plaintiff recover against the Defendants her costs by her in this behalf expended.
