P. H. & John H. Diddle, his Committee, (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, conditioned according to law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration in the estate of the said John Hines, with his well amount in due form. It being declared and oath that the estate real & personal of the said John Hines decd. does not exceed in value the sum of One thousand dollars.

Ordered that J. W. Diddle, Leolin Scarborough, & Albert Brands, being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of the estate of John Hines decd. & return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerk of this County.

John W. Nicholas agent for Wm. H. Drury, having made complaint in Court before a Justice of the peace, of this County, that Peter Conley is justly indebted to the said Wm. H.
