

Sum of Two hundred dollars, conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the Estate of the said John Stens, of Seagrim &c, and the will annexed in due form. It being declared we bear that the said Estate real & personal of Thomas & Seagrim don't exceed the sum of One thousand dollars.—

The Court recommends Edward S. Price, to be appointed Constable in the First Magisterial district in that County, in the room of Thomas A. P., who ^{is} ~~is~~ ^{deemed} to qualify.

That & doth administrate with the will annexed of John Stens same appears in County and consider his representation which the County records, shew and in the opinion of Simeon Hins ^{Administrator} together with James T. Hins & John W. Brittle, his Sureties, (who justify us both as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged to a Court in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, Condition according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the Estate of the said John Stens, with his will annexed in due form. It being declared we bear that the Estate real & personal of the said John Stens don't exceed in value the sum of One thousand Dollars.—

Ordered that J. W. Brittle, Leman Scarborough, & Simeon Branch, being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of the Estate of John Stens and to return the appraisements unto these hands to the Clerk of this County.

John W. Richardson agent for H. M. Treasury, having made complaint in Court before a Justice of the peace, of this County that Peter Conley is justly indebted to the said H. M. Treasury as appears in the sum of Two hundred Dollars, payable on the 3rd of December 1867, and that to the best of the said affiants belief the said Peter Conley intends to reward his efforts so that there will probably not be thrown sufficiently affreight of the said Peter Conley to satisfy the aforesaid claim & the said Treasury whom judgment is obtained, therefore demand unto the Ordinary process of law be used to obtain such garnishment, and the Justice having granted and attachment against the Estate of the said Peter Conley returnable to this County, which does bear bonds and 16 or 20 Mls. of Cons. 1000 lbs bread fedder, 8 or 1000 lbs of Salt Cota, and one lot of Shattoes, (This day came the Plaintiff by his attorney and the Defendant being solemnly called came not,) and is appearing to the Satisfaction of the Court, that the said Peter Conley is indebted to the said H. M. Treasury, the sum of £ 200. mentioned in the attachment, with interest thereon from the 3rd December 1867, till paid. It is therefore Conversed that the said H. M. Treasury, recover of and the said Peter Conley the said Two hundred Dollars, with interest thereon from the 3rd December 1867, till paid, and his Costs of law in this behalf expended.
