Having how much each one shall pay, whether it shall be paid in installments or all at once and at what time and report the same to the Court together with any special matter deemed pertinent by himself or which may be so required to be stated by any of the parties interested.

John D. Portis who stands committed to the Jail of this County charged with a felony by him committed in this that he did on the 16th of December in the year 1867 in this County in the night time maliciously and unlawfully shoot, with intent to kill one Thomas Reilly - was this day set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this Court and through the said John Portis moved the Court to allow him to enter into recognizance without security for his personal appearance before this Court on the first day of March Term next to answer the Commonwealth of the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged which entered the Court sustained and allows the said John Portis to enter into said recognizance in the penalty of One thousand dollars. Whereupon the said John Portis here in Court acknowledges himself indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of One thousand dollars to be made and levied of his gross & chattels lands and tenements if he the said John Portis shall make default in the performance of the condition and covenants therein.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that if the above bound John Portis shall personally appear before the Justice of the County Court of Southampton County at the Courthouse on the first day of the next March Term thereof and shall there and then answer the Commonwealth of Virginia, for and concerning the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged, and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then the above recognizance to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
