Jenkins has had legal notice of this motion he was solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant John D. Jenkins \$27.77 due with legal interest accrued from the 18 day of May 1868 - being a sum equal to the interest for one year on the sum of \$469.90 principal debt due by the defendant to the plaintiff by judgment of this Court rendered against the Defendants in the Circuit Court of Southampton County and that the party recover against the said debt. Jenkins his costs by him on this behalf expended.

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendant has had legal notice of this motion he was solemnly called but came not.
