

considered by the Court that the said Stephen Boykin be imprisoned in the jurisdiction of this Commonwealth for the term of twelve months, the period by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court remove and safely convey the said the said Tom Buck from the jail of this Court to the said Sheriff's jurisdiction, there to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And therefore the said Stephen Boykin is remanded to jail.

Ordered that A. D. Stephenson, Zachariah T. Johnson & Peter Compe being first duly sworn for the purpose do appear all the goods chattels of David A. Rogers esq; that may be produced or shewed to them and return the appearance under their hands to the Clerk of this Court.

John Ravelle who stands indicted of house breaking was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and the trial of the said John Ravelle is continued till the next term. And on the motion of the said John Ravelle he is allowed to vindict himself to be bound in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars with good security or the like sum of two hundred fifty dollars conditioned for his personal appearance of the said John Ravelle before the Court on the first day of June Term next by Eleazar O'Clock in the morning. Whereas the Commonwealth of and concerning the filing of which he stands indicted. Whereupon the said John Ravelle with Davis Vick his attorney here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said John Ravelle in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars and the said Davis Vick in the like sum of one hundred and fifty dollars of their respective goods and chattels, land and tenements to be levied to the use of the said Commonwealth if the said John Ravelle shall make default in performance of the condition underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound John Ravelle shall make default under his personal appearance before this Court on the first day of June Term by Eleazar O'Clock in the morning then and there to answer the Commonwealth for and concerning the filing of which he stands indicted and shall not depart thereof without leave of the Court then the above obligation to be void or to remain in full force and virtue.

Ordered that John James be required to remove the raft from George bridge immediately and present his claim at this Court next.

Tom Buck who stands indicted of house breaking was this day set to the bar by the jailor of this Court and being tried of arraignment pleaded not guilty to the indictment whereupon came a jury to sit E. R. Fife, William Gray, James Vaughan, Robert M. Williams, Edwin Bradshaw, David Hutchinson, Joe O. Johnson, Benj. A. Bryant, Brother B. Bryant, David H. Harlock, Richard Stephenson & Alfred D. Stephenson who being seated according to law, tried and found the truth to speak of upon the information, and having heard the witness upon their oaths returned a verdict in these words "We the jury find the prisoner guilty and affix his term of imprisonment in the jurisdiction to one year". And thereupon it being demanded of the said Tom Buck, if any thing for himself he had or knew to say why the Court here should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is ordered by the Court that the said Tom Buck be imprisoned in the jurisdiction of this Commonwealth for the term of One year, the period by the jurors without verdict ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court remove and safely convey the said Tom Buck from the jail of this Court to the said Sheriff's jurisdiction therewit to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law. And throughout the said Tom Buck is remanded to jail.
