

Sam Jacobs who stands indicted of housebreaking was left in the bar in custody of the factor of the court, through arrangement and pleaded not guilty to the indictment, thereupon came a jury to wit, Thomas Camp, J. S. Gray, W. E. Morris, F. S. Morris, J. S. Crumpler, James H. Barnes, W. R. Bryant, Alexander Knight, Gordon E. Edwards, George Whitfield, W. B. Lamb & Giles Pope & who being elected, sworn & sworn the truth upon the promises to speak, and having heard the evidence, upon their oath do say, "We the jury find the prisoner guilty, and ascertain the term of his confinement in the Penitentiary, Eighteen years." And thereupon it being demanded of the said Sam Jacobs if anything for himself he had or knew to say, why the Court here stood not, who proceed to pronounced judgment against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said Sam Jacobs be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the period of eighteen years, the period of the years in their verdict ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do so soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said Sam Jacobs from the jail of this Court to the said Penitentiary where to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by law, and thereupon the said Sam Jacobs is remanded to jail.

Alfred Bryant who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here to answer the Commonwealth of a certain felony, whereof he stands indicted was solemnly called but came not therefore on the motion of the Attorney for the Commonwealth it is ordered that a writ of Habeas be issued against the said Alfred Bryant to the Sheriff of this County directed returnable here tomorrow.

The Attorney for the Commonwealth with the assent of the Court saith he will not further prosecute against Luther Faulkner upon the bill of indictment against him for housebreaking, therefore it is ordered that the same be dismissed.
