

This day came John Tulliver, who alleges that he is aggrieved by an entry on the property books made by Mrs. Allen's Commissioner of the Revenue for said County, in the year 1858, whereby he is charged with £150. taxes for the year 1858, at £5000. interest on the Commissioners' property books as income, and thereupon the said John Tulliver seeks the Court to recover him from the payment of the said £150. all of the same amount, charged against him for the said year 1858, which he claims was deposited by the said John Tulliver, the attorney for the Commissioners for said County, in the said Mrs. Allen's Commissioner's entry of the said £150. and he claims as a set-off touching the application, and it appearing that the said sum of £5000. was the amount of the said of the said sum for 1857, & erroneously entered as income, and it appearing that application for relief against the erroneous entry was made this day for the first time. All which the Court certifies as facts found upon the application aforesaid. And considering whereas the said John Tulliver seeks to recover the said £150. the Court is satisfied that the said John Tulliver is erroneously charged, and that he is aggrieved by the said entry, and it is ordered that the said John Tulliver, be recovered from the payment of £150. taxes he erroneously charged, of his already paid, and if paid, that it be refunded to him.

Ordered that the following accounts in favour of said John Tulliver, to wit, one amounting to £177 58, another amounting to £44. another amounting to £430. another amounting to £15 46, and another amounting to £12 11, be certified to the Auditor of public accounts for his examination & payment.
