Henry Hill who stands committed to the jail of this County charged with a felony by himself committed in that he did on the 8th day of November 1868 in this County did unlawfully, maliciously and feloniously cut with a knife with intent to maim, disfigure, maim and kill Geo. Johnson was set to the law in custody of the jailer of this Court, and through the said Henry Hill moved the Court to allow him to give bail for his appearance before the Court on the first day of March Term next to answer on indictment which may be preferred against him by the grand jury for the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged. The Court on hearing the evidence with order that the said Henry Hill be allowed to give bail himself to enter into a recognizance in the penalty of \$200 with good security to the like sum of \$200. Which recognizance may be entered into in the custody of the Court before a Justice of the Peace of this County.

Tom Boon who stands committed to the jail of this County charged with a felony by him committed in that he feloniously aided in breaking and entering the storehouse of Roger Ferguson & carrying off goods, was set to the law in custody of the jailer of this Court and through the said Tom Boon moved the Court to allow him to give bail for his personal appearance before this Court on the first day of March Term next to answer the Commissioner for and concerning the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged. The Court on hearing the evidence with order that the said Tom Boon be allowed to give bail by entering into a recognizance himself in the sum of \$900 with good security in the like sum of \$900 which recognizance may be taken by a Justice of the Peace.
