Henry Hall who stands committed to the jail of this County charged with being unlawfully, maliciously and feloniously cut with a knife with intent to maim, disfigure, disable and kill his son Edward was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this court, and thereupon the said Henry Hall moved the court to allow him to give bail for his appearance before the Court on the first day of March next to answer and be judgment which may be pronounced against him by the grand jury for the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged. The Court on hearing the evidence did order that the said Henry Hall be allowed to give such bail himself to enter into a recognizance in the penalty of \$200 with good security with like sum of \$100. Which recognizance may be entered into in the record of this court before a Justice of the Peace of this County

Sam Board who stands committed to the jail of this County charged with a felony by being committed in this that he feloniously aided in breaking and entering the storehouse of Dyer & Ferguson & carrying off goods, was set to the bar in custody of the jailor of this court and thereupon the said Sam Board moved the court to allow him to give bail for his personal appearance before this court on the first day of March next to answer the commissioners for and concerning the felony aforesaid of which he stands charged. The court after hearing the evidence did order that the said Sam Board be allowed to give such bail by entering into a recognizance himself or the sum of \$800 with good security in the like sum of \$400. Which recognizance may be taken by a Justice of the Peace
