The Court doth adjudge James B. Dick, Guardian of Samuel A. White, William J. Dick, son to Dick, Mary S. Dick & Richard D. Dick, children of Richard White, and his wife, deceased, the said James B. Dick, entitled to a third in the property of See Glens and dwellings, conditioned according to law, with such a restriction, Sam'l. White, C. C. Williams & Henry S. Newell his Sonnies, which sum being acknowledged by the Officers deposed, is ordered to be recorded & Stamp of the Int. Rev. of the United States to the amount of 100 dollars being affixed to said bond and duly cancelled.

The last will & Testament of Charles F. Argentor died. & his creditors named Barnes, and bearing date 20th day of February 1867, and the other bearing date the 24th day of January 1867, were presented to the County, and the said will and the creditors bearing date the 24th day of January 1867, was proved by the Oaths of James E. Atkinson the Subscribing witness thereto, and ordered to be recorded as the last will & Testament & Creditors Bonds of Charles F. Argentor died. And on the Motion of William Argentor & J. W. Argentor, the Executors named in the said will who were back according to law & entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty Thousand Dollars, conditioned according to law (the will directing the security to be required of them, & the bonds requiring same,) which bond bearing a stamp of the Int. Rev. of the United States to the amount of 100 dollars being affixed thereto & duly cancelled is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is given to said William Argentor & J. W. Argentor ^{for obtaining} of the Int. Rev. in due form, stamp of the Int. Rev. of the United States to the amount of \$12.50 being affixed thereto and duly cancelled.

Ordered that Henry M. Bates, James E. Settree, C. P. Atkinson and Wm. W. Coffey, & any three of them, being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of the Estate of Charles F. Argentor died. & return the appraisement under their hands to the Clerks of this County.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next term.
