Bradshaw & John Henry, who have been appointed Justices of the Peace for this County, the two first on the 1st & the other on the 5th Magistrate District of this County, this day produced Certificates of their qualification & also filed a Copy of the last process by Congress of July 2nd 1862, which Certificates of qualification are ordered to be filed.

J. L. Dyer who has been appointed Sheriff of this County, to fill the vacancy caused by the removal of Samuel Killo from Office, by Commission dated County Court Major General W. L. A. dated the 28th of May 1869, & this day appeared in Court & together with Wells Bradshaw, James F. White, M. M. Clayton, A. P. Stephens, L. C. Cobb & W. F. Dickerson his Sureties, made, entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty thousand dollars, conditioned according to said which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said D. L. Dyer also took the Oath required by the laws of Virginia, to wit, 1st The Oath of fidelity to the Government of Virginia. 2nd The oath to support the Constitution of the United States. 3rd The oath duly sworn before the Court of Office & 5th The Oath required by Congress of the 2nd July 1862.

J. L. Dyer, Sheriff of the County, with the Consent of the Court, doth appoint Geo. H. Dyer & William H. Dyer as his Deputies, & it appearing to the Court that they are men of himself & good demeanor, & thereupon they qualified by taking the Oath required by the laws of the State to wit, 1st The Oath of allegiance to the Government, 2nd The Oath to support the Constitution of the United States, 3rd The oath duly sworn before the Court of Office.
