 to Messrs. S. & A. Seadericks, which is Ordered to be recorded.

Messrs. John H. Holmes, & Edgar B. Butler, who have been appointed Justices
 of the Peace in the 3rd Magisterial District & Brown all appeared for the
 3rd Magisterial District, this day appeared in Court & qualified by taking
 the Oaths required by the Laws of the State of Virginia & also took
 the Oath prescribed by an act of Congress of July 3rd 1842.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County, deliver out of the arduous business of the
 County to the first day of the next Term to lay the County Levy.

John W. Jackson, who has been appointed a Justice of the Peace in the
 3rd Magisterial District, this day appeared in Court & qualified by
 taking the Oaths required by the Laws of the State of Virginia & also
 the Oath prescribed by the act of Congress of July 3rd 1842.

On the Motion of James J. Jordan, It is Ordered that J. L. Selby Sheriff
 of this County, take into his hands the Estate of Jacob Jordan dec.
 & administer the same according to Law.

Ordered that Lucy F. Jones Treasurer of the County of Loudoun be allowed
 to expend one hundred dollars against the said County's income for
 the purpose of paying the expenses of two Education, Board
 & Clothing &c. for the years 1848 & 1849.

Charles Beale who has been appointed a Constable for the 3rd
 Magisterial District of this County, this day appeared in Court
 & qualified by taking the Oaths required by the Laws of
 the State of Virginia & also the Oath prescribed by an
 act of Congress of July 3rd 1842. And also by entering
 into bond with James all which has been in the penalty of
 two thousand dollars conditioned according to Law, which
 bond having a Stamp of the Int. Sec. of the United States
 to the amount of the dollar being affixed thereto and
 duly cancelled, is Ordered to be recorded.

James C. Johnson who has been appointed Comptroller
 of the Revenue in the 3rd District in this County to fill the
 vacancy caused by the removal of Benjamin F. Applewhite from
 the Office, this day appeared in Court & qualified by taking the
 Oaths required by the Laws of the State of Virginia & also the
 Oath prescribed by an act of Congress of July 3rd 1842.
