and it is ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting justices of this County, to the  
day of my next Term, and advise or sign the said report.

Ordered that the account of J. H. Remington for services rendered as Counselor, the  
attorney at this Term, amounting to \$150. be referred to the Auditor of Public accounts  
for his examination & payment.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of the County to the first day  
of September Term next to lay the County levy the select juries for the trial of petit  
cases and to lay the County levy.

Stirling Hodge who stands indicted of murder was led to the bar in custody  
of the jailer of this Court thereof arraigned and upon his arraignment demanded to be  
tried in the Circuit Court having jurisdiction over this County. The said Stirling  
Hodge moved the Court to be allowed to enter into recognizance with surety for his  
appearance before the said Circuit Court, to answer for the said offence which motion  
the Court entertained and allowed the said Stirling Hodge to enter into such recognizance  
himself in the sum of two thousand dollars, with sufficient security in the like sum of  
two thousand dollars. And thereupon the said Stirling Hodge with Joseph B  
Prince, James H. Handie, James A. Hodge, George W. Hughes his sureties (who  
justified on oath as to their sufficiency) here in Court severally and respectively acknow-  
ledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the manner and  
form following, that is to say, the said Stirling Hodge in the sum of two thousand  
dollars and the said Joseph B. Prince, James H. Handie, James A. Hodge and  
George W. Hughes in the sum of two thousand dollars, to be respectively made out  
by a list of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the Com-  
monwealth of Virginia, if the said Stirling Hodge shall make default in the  
performance of the underwritten condition.

The Court being of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound  
Stirling Hodge do not shall personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit  
Court of Southampton County on the first day of the next Term to answer for the  
offence with which he stands charged and shall not depart thence without the  
leave of the said Court then the above recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain  
in full force and virtue.

Martha Everett, Jenny Williams, George Harris, Lewis Harris & Benjamin Day  
here in Court severally & respectively acknowledge themselves to be indebted to the  
Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of one hundred dollars each, to be levied of  
their goods and chattels, lands and tenements, respectively, to the use of the said  
Commonwealth of the said Martha Everett, Jenny Williams, George Harris, Lewis  
Harris & Benjamin Day shall make default in the condition underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Martha  
Everett, Jenny Williams, George Harris, Lewis Harris & Benjamin Day, shall  
personally appear the Judge of the Circuit Court of Southampton County on the  
first day of the next Term of the said Court then and there to give evidence on  
behalf of the Commonwealth against Stirling Hodge who stands indicted of
