This Cause the day came on to be heard at the hall of the Sheriff, counsel for the Defendant Henry Survey, and of the instant Defendants by S^r Edward their counsel, and being and was argued by counsel, and consideration thereof the Court is of opinion that James G. Jones, father to Geoffrey, is at 2. September, who not having appointed special Commissioners for that purpose, proceed to allot by Master and himself to Henry Survey, widow of Thomas Survey, and David Sargent & Joseph, and report to Court. And the Court did further require, Order and decree, that James G. Jones, who in liberty appointed a Special Commissioners for that purpose, proceed to do as justice and law to the highest extent, after having given in Court Survey, copy view of land and plans of said, the said Estate in the last Memorial, of which Thomas Survey, did Sargent and Joseph, subject to the said said rights, in the following terms, to wit: Sufferments in Court to express, expunge of said and said, the balance as a credit of his estate, taking him from purchase with good and sufficient Security, carrying interest, from which had together with a report of his proceedings under this Survey, he is directed to return to Court. But the said Commission is not to exceed the provisions of this decree. And he shall have given him with good and sufficient Security in the Court Office of the Court, in the presence of (S^r Edward) payable to the Commission of Virginia, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties therein assigned him.

This day the Cause came on to be heard in the presence personally and in my request by counsel, and consideration thereof, the Court did signify Order and decree, that the same entered in the Cause at November Term 1797 be removed to the next as follows, that Amos Kitchin, (S^r Edward & Joseph) and W^o H. Gooding, who are hereby appointed Special Commissioners for that purpose, proceed forth to allot to Amos Beale, widow of Thomas Beale, two third parts, (having due regard to quality and value) of the said Estate of which Thomas Beale did Sargent and Joseph, for that same, that proceed to divide and allot into three equal shares, to parts, (having due regard to quality and value) the least of land in the said Memorial which Thomas Beale did Sargent, and said in that to Thomas Beale, the share to Henry G. Beale and two thirds to the heirs of Nathan Beale and report their proceedings under the same to Court.
