

The Petition of William Jewell against William Lucas
is Dismissed.

Thomas Brown having obtained an Attachment against
the Estate of William Colson, who hath privately absconded
surrendered himself so that the Ordinary Process of Law
cannot be used on him, for fifteen pounds eight Shillings
due by Note of Hand. Samuel Blom Gent Sheriff of this
County now in default that he hath attached all the
Estate of the said William Colson in the Hands of Joseph
Powell his Garnishee This Day Came the said Thomas
Brown and the said Joseph Powell having been duly
summoned appeared and being first sworn Deposed
that he hath come to the said William Colson the Sum of
six pounds four Shillings by an Agreement between them
he was to discharge by the payment of six Shillings.
Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said
Garnishee deliver the said six Shillings to the Sheriff of
this County and that the Sheriff sell the same at Public
Auction for ready Money And there with discharge the
afore said Debt so far much thereof as the said Sale shall
amount to, and Costs of this Suit And that he also return
an Account of his proceedings therein to the Court.

Ordered that Ishmael Taylor out of the Money now in
his Hands of this County do pay to Benjamin Limmon on
the Sum of six Shillings for keeping Limmon's Bridge
over Notaway River in Repair.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the Courten Court
