 also stole from his Plantation a Grey Stone Horse
 the Property of his Son Henry Pevon And this Deponent
 faith that on his Offering some Reward ~~for~~ and being
 himself in Search of the Thief in North Carolina
 the Prisoner at the Bar was brought to him with the
~~above~~ said Horse & several of the aforesaid Goods that
 on searching the Prisoner they found some Money tied
 up in the Tail of his shirt ~~among~~ among which was
 a counterfeit Piece of eight which ~~was~~ from its being
 remarkable this Deponent faith is his That the
 Prisoner was desiring for some Time in his Store the
 Monday before the Robbery was committed And
 further faith not John Kirby being sworn faith
 That on the 16th Day of July last past there came to
 his Plantation a Middle sized Bay Horse with
 on his higher shoulder & Buttocks CB that supposing
 him to be a Steal he seized the said Horse according to
 Law And the Deponent further faith That on the 14th
 Day of November last the Prisoner came to him by the
 Name of Thomas Bond for and upon his Deponing
 the Horse & saying that he was his Property this Depon-
 ed deliver the said Horse to him And further faith not
 The Deponent John Pevon being ~~sworn~~ further Examined
 faith That the Morning after his said Horse was stole
 And his Horse lost then he found a Horse at his
 Plantation which Horse answers the Description of
 that in Kirby's Deposition and he being ^{believed} to be the same
 Henry Pevon being sworn faith That the Horse on
 which the Goods stolen out of his Father's Store were
 found is the Property of him this Deponent. Upon
