ought to be tried at the next General Court to be held at the  
Courthouse in the City of Williamsburg on the first Day  
thereof and the time for his arraignment to Gary.

Be it Remembred That John Brown John Herby &  
Henry Parsons of the County of Southampton have acknowledged  
and severally acknowledged themselves Indebted to our  
Sovereign Lord King George the second in the sum of twenty  
pounds each of their respective lands & Tenements Goods &  
Chattels to be paid Mr our said Lord the King his Heire and  
Successioners Individually Yet upon this Condition that if they and  
each of them respectively shall personally appear before  
the said Justice of the General Court to be held at the  
Courthouse in the City of Williamsburg on the first Day  
thereof then others to give such Evidence as they and each  
of them knoweth against the John Hill Concerning the same  
that may with effect prove the guilt of the said John Hill  
Treason of which he is now charged Then this Recognoissance  
to be void

The Minutes of these Proceedings were signed Gray  
Sept 12th 1760

At a Court Held for the County of Southampton on Tuesday  
the 13<sup>rd</sup> Day of December 1760.

An Indenture of Settlement between Lazarus Howell  
of Elizabeth his wife of the one part and Joseph Gray  
of the other part and a Memorandum of every of ten  
Memorandums were proved by the Oaths of Joseph Gray  
Thomas Williams and James Francis Edward Robins his  
Witnesses thereto and together with this Commission  
ancreed for taking the Acknowledgment of his  
Examination of the said Lazarus Howell & a certificate of his  
Prosecution thereof was directed to be recorded
