Be it Remembred That John Brown John Lerby &
Harry Pearson of the County of Southampton lawfully docket
and severally acknowledged themselves ^{to be} Debtors to our
Sovereign Lord King George the second in the Sum of twenty
pounds each of their respective dantes & Cements Goods &
Chattel to be levied to our said Lord the King his heirs and
Successors &c. Yet upon this Condition that if they and
each of them respectively shall personally appear before
~~the Honorable Justice~~ ^{the} General Court to be held at this
Court House in the City of Williamsburg on the sixth Day
thereof then & there to give such Evidence as they and each
of them shall think proper ^{and that they will appear in person} ~~concerning the said~~ ^{to the said}
Tolony of which he is now charged then their Recognizance
to be void
