

An Act concerning a road and place of building
at Brueves was this day made by the persons of
to run the same and is in the words following this
to an order of Southampton court bearing date the
thirtieth day of August 1752. We the Subscribers being
first sworn have desired the road and place for
building a bridge at Brueves and we finde refelons
towrd that this old road ought to be removed and kept
in repair with a small alteration on the south
side along the hill side a little higher up the
Creek than the present road and will answer the
same passage through the creek that there ought
to be a bridge built at this place were the former
bridge was built to answer the said road And that
the road will be convenient as well for the
inhabitants of the said county as for others given
under our hands this third day of November 1752.

And It is Ordered that John Johnson be appointed overseer
of the said road and with the male labouring titheable
in his present make alterations mentioned in the
said road and keep the said road in repair according
to law

Ordered that Timothy Thorpe James Jones and John
Willrich do contract and agree with workmen to
build a bridge at Brueves and keep the same in
repair seven years and make up cost thereof to the
court

according to her certificate is granted him for obtaining
letters of administration on the estate of Rich^d Thom
son giving security whereupon he with Thomas
Clifton his security subscriber and acknowledge this
bond for the Opylands due and faithful administration
of the said decessants estate
