indebted to our fowright lord King George the second
in the sum of five hundred pounds of his lands
and timentes goods and chattles to be levied to our
said lord the King his heirs and successours
Yet upon this condition that if the said John Clifton
shall make his personal appearance at the court
of Bys and Turniers in the City of Williamsburg on
the second Tuesday in December next then and then
to answer to our said fowright lord the King concerning
the felony aforesaid and to do and receive what
shall be enjoined him by the said court then this
recognizance to be void

John Megarity John Wilkinson Thomas Day Joshua
Dawson Henry Dawson and Thomas Jarrell severally
came into court and acknowledged themselves indebted
to our fowright lord the King his heirs and successours
in the sums of ten pounds each of their joint several
lands and timentes goods and chattles to be levied
and to our said lord the King his heirs and successours
Yet upon this condition that if they shall
respectively make their personal appearance at the
courthouse in the City of Williamsburg on the said
Tuesday in December next then and then to testify
and the truth to say on behalf of our said lord the
King against John Clifton for felony then this
recognizance to be void
