now in his possession we find the said negro is of the price
of £45 pounds and if upon the whole matter the
court shall adjudge the law to be for the plaintiff
We find for him the negro in the declaration mentioned
if to be had if not to be had £45 the price of him
and one pious damage for detaining the said negro
otherwise we find for the defendant And the cause
is continued till the next week for the matters of law
arising thereupon to be argued
