sum of four pounds for the maintenance of the said
Largus Whitehead and eight pound for Edith Whitehead
four pound for William Whitehead & three pound for
maintaining a negro boy belonging to the said William
and five pound for Jesse Whitehead & three pounds for
maintaining a negro boy belonging to Edith
Whitehead by the respective guardians
