This day were the parties by their attorneys and themselves also a jury, to wit, Charles Swinburne, Henry Blunt, Joseph Colly, John Mitchell, George Branch & Woodward, William Washington, Isaac Hearn, Richard Kirby, William Kiley, William Pope and Joseph Deth who being elected tyne and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon them hath do say that the defendants have broken the condition of the recognizance in the declaration mentioned and thereupon the said William Johnson, Thomas Williamson and Robert Moore by their attorney now at this day come and pray the judgment on the writ and proceeding aforesaid may be stayed for the following reason, to wit, first it appears by the Declaration of our sovereign lord the King that the writing therein supposed to have been interdicted by the said defendant as a recognizance was taken by Samuel Blom late Sheriff of the said county of Hampshire who was not empowered by law to take recognizances and therefore the same supposed writing was void ab initio secondly that the said attorney of our said lord the King by the said declaration demands agt the said Deth that they jointly render to our sovereign lord the King the sum of forty pounds when it appears by the said declaration that the said defendant undividedly by the said supposed recognizance each one for himself and not one for the other in several several sums amounting in the whole to the said sum of forty
