these oaths do say that the defendant doth not detain the
negro slave in the declaration mentioned Therefore It is
considered by the court that the plaintiff take nothing by
his bill but for his fault clamour to in vain and that
the defendant go hence without day and noon against
the said plaintiff his costs by him about her (expenses in
this behalf expended)

William Andrews being summoned for his contempt in
not appearing as a jury man being solemnly called and not
appearing It is ordered that the said W^m Andrews make
his fine with our Lord the King by the payment of four
hundred pounds of Tobacco unless he appear to make his
excuse at the next court.

An indenture of suffragant between John Brown of the
one part and Benjamin Brown of the other part was
proved by the oaths of Samuel Blaw Marshall Blaw
Benjamin Vaper the witnesses thereto ordered to be read.
Ann Matthews sister of Hugh Matthews died
having obtained an attachment against the estate of
William Matthews who hath privately removed himself
or is abroad that the ordinary process of law cannot
be used upon him for eight pounds one shilling seven pence
due to the said Ann Joseph Gray gent. Sheriff of this
county remade return that he had executed this said attachment
in hands of James Reddy his quartermaster This day came the
said Ann who proved her demand of eight pounds one
shilling and seven pence to be just by her own oaths Therefore
It is considered by the court that she recover against the said
William the said eight pounds one shilling and seven
pence and her costs by her in this behalf expended and that
