The last will and testament of Elizabeth Richards was presented & proved by the oaths of Thomas Langley a notary, Hunt and ordered to be recorded and on the petition of Richard Richards the Esq. therein named who solemnly affirmed that he being one of the people called quakers / witnesses is granted him for obtaining approbation thereof in due form giving security whereupon he with Joshua Britton his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds for the said Richards due and faithful administration of the said deceased estate and performance of her will.

Ordered that Henry Blunt Isaac Mason Richard Harlow and Benjamin Clifton or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace to appraise in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of Elizabeth Richards & to return the appraisement to the court.

Ordered that the sheriff summon twenty four of the most capable Freeholders of this county not being ordinary keepers constables surveyors of highways or owners or occupiers of mills to attend the court in May next to be sworn a Grand Jury of inquest on the body of the county.
