For reasons appearing to the court James Hearty is
exempted from paying public county & parish levies

An indenture of feoffment between John Gray of the
one part and Benjamin Gray of the other part and
the receipt thereon endorsed were proved by the oath
of William Lane the same having been heretofore proved
and ordered to be recorded

Present Thomas Williamson gent Abner Howell Edwards

The last will and testament of John Pleasant was presented
in court by Howell Edwards the executor therein named
proved by the oath of Howell Edwards jur a witness thereof
and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said
executor who made oath according to law certificate is granted
him for obtaining approbation thereof in due form giving
security whereupon he with Richard Hills his security
entered into and acknowledged their bond for the said
Howells due and faithful administration of the said decedents
estate and performance of his will

Ordered that Henry Vaughan David Edwards James
Turner & William Burgess any three of them being sworn
before a justice of the peace do appraise in current
money the slaves of ~~the~~ and personal estate of John
Pleasant ~~decd~~ and return the appraisement to
the court

For reasons appearing to the court Mary Powell a miller
is exempted from paying levies in this county

A deed from Edward Mordham to Eustice
Mordham was proved by the oath of Joseph Gray the same
having been heretofore proved and ordered to be recorded
