 and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf  
 expended and It is ordered that this suit as to the defendant  
 Thomas be dismissed But this judgment except as to  
 the costs is to be discharged by the payment of seven pounds  
 nine shillings and nine pence together with interest for  
 the same to be computed after the rate of five per cent  
 per annum from the 9<sup>th</sup> day of December 1754 to the  
 time of payment and the said defendant in money
