and Bagley having been duly summoned and not
appearing or offering anything in excuse It is -
considered by the court that they respectively forfeit &
pay to the churchwardens of Wottonway parish twenty
shillings or two hundred pounds of Tobacco and
the costs costs of these prosecutions

Upon the complaint of John Piche agst James
Jones his master for misage the parties being
heard It is ordered that the said servant be -
removed from his said master and the former
indentures cancelled And It is ordered that the
churchwardens bind the said John out again -
according to law and that the said Jones pay costs

An indenture of feoffment between John Jackson of -
the one part and John Clayton of the other part and
the memorandum of livery of seisin and receipt -
thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of Thomas
Williamson Richard Baker and Richard Fells
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded

Upon the petition of Thomas Moys against John
Wiggins for two pounds five shillings and five pence
due by account This day came the plaintiff and the
defendant having been duly summoned and served
with a copy of the petition and account and not
appearing on the motion of the said plaintiff
is considered by the court that the plaintiff
agst the said defendant the said two pounds &
shillings and five pence and his costs by him
