 Arthur Taylor. estate of the said Arthur Taylor the having
 that the ordinary process of law cannot
 be served upon for a debt due to the said
 persons estate

William Scott one of the plaintiffs in this cause being
 dead since the awarding the attachment aforesaid the same as to him
 is dismissed & Benjamin Simmones gent Sheriff of this county now
 made return that he had executed the said attachment in the
 hands of Thomas Turner and Volentine Simmones and summoned
 them as garnistees of the said Arthur whereupon the said
 Thomas Turner appeared & being first sworn deposed that
 he hath in his hands of the estate of the said Arthur the
 sum of four pounds two shillings and six pence and the said
 Volentine Simmones being also sworn deposed that he hath
 in his hands the sum of two shillings six pence & thereupon
 the said Joseph Scott proved his demand of seven nineteen shillings and
 six pence to be just Therefore It is Considered by the court that the said
 Joseph recover agst the said Arthur the said seven pounds nineteen
 shillings and six pence and his costs by him in this behalf expended
 And It is Ordered that the said Thomas Turner & Volentine Simmones
 do pay the respective sums concerned in their hands to the said
 Joseph Scott towards satisfaction of this judgment And It is further
 Ordered that Joseph Ewert be summoned to appear here at the next
 court to declare what estate he hath in his hands belonging to the
 said Arthur Taylor.

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of nottway bind

The presentments of the grand jury against Benjamin Williams
