The last will and testament of Edward Pate was proved by the oath
of Abraham Wiggins the same having been heretofore proved ordered
to be recorded

An indenture of feoffment tripartite between the chief men of the northern
indian nation of the first part Joseph Gray William Taylor and Howell
Edmunds of the second part and Howell Edmunds junr of the third
was proved by the oaths of Benjamin Wood Benjamin Williams & Charles
Briggs witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded

Ordered that the flat swamp be built at the expense of the
county and that John Peyron David Edmunds & Joshua Claud or any two
of them do agree with workmen to build the same and make report
thereof to the court
