An indenture of feoffment between William Simmons of the one part and Paulson Cooke of the other part and the memorandum of livery of seisin and receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said William Simmons and ordered to be recorded

An indenture of feoffment between Nerrit Drem and Mary his wife of the one part and Arthur Waller of the other part was acknowledged by the said Nerrit and Mary Joke being first privately examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded

Ordered that John Person William Person and James Turner do view the place over Nocteria River at Taylors Quarter and report whether the same is convenient for a bridge or not the same being proposed by the county court of Brunswick

The last will and testament of Charles Webb was presented in court by Elizabeth Webb the executrix therein named proved by the oaths of Benjamin Clements Thomas Caple and Arthur Gilliam the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded And on the Motion of the said executrix who made oath according to law certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security whereupon she together with Benjamin Simmons and John Caple her securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £500 for the said Elizabeths due and faithful administration on the said decedents estate and performance of his will

Ordered that Charles Barham Thomas Holt Christopher Totteny Walter Gilliam or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace to appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Charles Webb deced and return the appraisement to the court
