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The plaintiff be at liberty to sell and convey the said lands at public auction for ready money giving notice at the ^{public} court house of this county of such sale and after deducting the aforesaid principal and interest the charges attending the sales and the costs of this suit that he pay the residue if any to the said defendant his heirs or assigns according to the intent and meaning of the covenant in the mortgage in the said bill particularly mentioned

The last will and testament of Thomas Drake deceased was presented in court by Thomas Drake and William Drake the executors therein named proved by the oaths of Benjamin Williams and Jacob Williams two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded And on the Motion of the said executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security whereupon the said executors together with Benjamin Williams and John Bowen their security entered into acknowledgment their bond in the penalty of £1000 for the said Thomas and Williams due and faithful admin on the said decedent's estate

Ordered that Nicholas Williams Jonas Williams Jacob Williams and Job Wright or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Thomas Drake deceased and return the appraisement to the court

The defendant not appearing to answer the bill of the plaintiff On the Motion of the said plaintiff by his counsel an attachment is awarded against the said defendant returnable to the next court

Upon the petition of Samuel Pepon admor &c of Robert Pepon deceased agt Morgan Drewry and William Ferguson for two pounds four shillings due by bond This day came as well the plaintiff by his attorney as the defendant Morgan in his proper person and the said defendant saith that he cannot gainsay the allegation of the said petition Therefore It is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant one pound two shillings together with interest for the same to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 10 day of January 1754 -
