 corn potatoes pease cotton &c. some lightwood on the land of John
 Blyth of the estate of the said John also in the hands of Benjamin
 Williams his garnishee This day came the said Thomas Fisher of
 the said garnishee who being first sworn deposed that he hath
 in his hands of the estate of the said Artis the sum of ten shillings
 Therefore On the Motion of the said Thomas Fisher It is considered
 by the Court that he recover against the said John Artis the sum
 of ten pounds and six pence together with interest for the same to be
 computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 1st
 of August 1757. to the time of payment and his costs by him in
