motion of the said Richard It is considered by the Court that he
recover against the said Thomas Langley five pounds nine shillings
and ten pence the debt due from the said Ingram to the said Richard
plus costs by him in this behalf expended

Ordered that summons issue against the several persons
this day presented by the grand jury to cause them to appear
at the next court & answer the same.

Ordered that the treasurer pay Richard Turby just the sum
of £2. 19. for the repair of the apamooseek swamp.

Ordered that Peter Butts and Miles Cary gent. do let the
repairs or rebuilding of the apamooseek bridges as they shall
see convenient.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court in course.

A Commission of oyer & terminer and dedimus potestatem
for the trial of Duk a negro man slave belonging to John Thomas
for feloniously stealing one bay gelding the property of William
Bryant was produced and read whereupon pursuant thereto
Joseph Gray had the usual oaths administered to him by John
Person and Samuel Blon which he took and subscribed the test
and then the said Joseph Gray administered all the said oaths to
James Ridley John Person Samuel Blon Nicholas Magist &
William Haynes which they also took and subscribed the test

The Court being thus constituted

The prisoner was set to the bar charged with the felony aforesaid
arraigned & pleaded not guilty & for his trial put himself upon
the court whereupon the prisoner alleged that he had diverse
material witnesses to examine on his behalf which he could
not now procure In consideration of which the trial of
the said slave is postponed till Thursday the 22^d day
of this instant and thereupon the said Duk is remanded
to goal

William Bryant and Henry Thomas acknowledged themselves to be
indebted to our sovereign Lord the King in the sum of twenty pounds
each of their respective goods and chattels land and tenements to be
levied and to our Lord the King his heirs and assigns rendered yet upon
this condition that if they shall appear here on Thursday the 22^d day
