certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on
the estate of James West deceased giving security whereupon the said John
Hall together with John Thirby and John Scarborough his security entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £100 for the said
Hall's due and faithful administration on the said deceased's estate

Ordered that John Thirby Moody Kirby Richard Thirby junr & John
Browne or any three of them being first sworn before a justice
