An indenture of feoffment between Major Tillar of the one part and Joseph Reese of the other part & a memorandum of livery of seisin thereon endorsed were proved by the oaths of Edward Reese and John Lundy two of the witnesses thereto.

The last will and testament of Henry Pope dec'd was presented in court by Richard Pope and Hodges Council the executors therein named proved by the oaths of Joseph Griffin and by the solemn affirmation of John Matthews one of the people called quakers of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the Motion of the said executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security whereupon the said executors together with Benjamin Benson & John Matthews their security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £1000 for the said executors due and faithful administration on the said decedents estate and performance of his will.

Ordered that Richard Worrell Samuel Johnson Henry Joyner & William Joyner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any of personal estate of Henry Pope dec'd & return the appraisement to the court.

An indenture of feoffment between Job Wright of the one part and Joseph Wick of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said Job and ordered to be recorded.

An indenture of feoffment between William Conner of the one part and Thomas Turner of the other part and the memorandum of livery of seisin thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said William Conner and ordered to be recorded and Martha the wife of the said William personally appeared in court and being first privately examined as the law directs voluntarily relinquished her right of dower in the estate conveyed by the said indenture.

An indenture of feoffment between John Emery of the one part and Robert Wilkins of the other part and the memorandum of livery of seisin thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said John Emery and ordered to be recorded and Mary the wife of the said John Emery personally appeared in court and being first privately examined as the
