Elias Love *petit* } In Trespass assault and Battery

 William Bennett (Defendant)

This day came the parties by their attorneys & thereupon came also a jury to wit Henry Crafford Cordal Norfleet William Grimmer Tho. Everitt Edmund Taylor Jacob Symons John Mundell Burnell Williamson Weather Harris Harry Harris John W. Demore & W. Cooper who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined upon their oath do say that the defendant is guilty of the trespass assault and battery in the declaration mentioned in manner and form as the plaintiff against him hath alleged and they do assess the plaintiff damages by occasion thereof to seven pounds ten shillings & his costs by him about this suit in this behalf expended. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said Defendant his damages above informed of assize & be taken &c

An Indenture of feoffment between George Collier & Jane Collier his wife & William Norman of the one part & Benjamin Worrell of the other part together with a memorandum of Livery of seisin thereon endorsed were acknowledged by George Collier and Jane his wife & William Norman the said Jane being first privily examined as the law directs & ordered to be recorded

An Indenture of feoffment between John Loya & Mary Loya of the one part & William Lankford of the other part together with a memorandum of Livery of seisin thereon endorsed were proved as to John Loya by the oath of the said Mary wife of the said John Loya by the oath of the said Francis Love witnesses thereto & acknowledged by the said John Loya the being first privily examined as the law directs & ordered to be recorded

On the motion of Henry Westbrook Thomas Westbrook Henry Applushair &c Lewis witnesses for our sovereign lord the king against Will. Johnson it is ordered that the said Johnson pay them one hundred & seventy five pounds of Tobacco each for seven days attendance on this Court respectively
