Ordered that the churchwardens bind out Britain & Charles Travis according to Law

An Indenture of Apprenticeship between George Gurley sen. of the one part & George Gurley jr. of the other part with a mem. of delivery of person & reception endorsed were acknowledged by the above named George Gurley sen. and ordered to be recorded

An Inventory and appraisement of the estate of Isaac Mason
was this day returned and ordered to be recorded

Upon the complaint of Thomas Gray j^r against Benjamin Worrell
j^r this day for a breach of the peace the parties appeared in Court who
being heard it is the opinion of the Court that he find security for
his good behaviour for the space of six months & that he also appear
at the next Court to be held in May to answer an indictment to
be exhibited against him by the said Thomas Gray j^r Whereupon
the said Benjamin with John Borving and James Kitchen his securities
came into Court and acknowledged themselves severally indebted to
our sovereign Lord King George third in the sum of £20 each To be
liens of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattles
and to our Lord the King & his heirs and successors rendered Yet upon
this condition that if the said Benjamin shall be of good behaviour
towards ~~us~~ ^{us} all his ^{in April 1711} liege people & more especially towards
the said Thomas Gray j^r for the space of six months next
to appear at the next Court to be held in May to answer the
afore^d Indictm^t & not depart hence without leave of the Court
Then this recognizance to be void
