

James Jordan Scott having obtained an attachment against the estate of James Walsh for two pounds fifteen shillings and five pence half penny who hath privately removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon James Ridley Gent Sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said Attachment on two beds & furniture one small looking glass 1 Apr & Hatbox 1 water pail & 2 Cakes of Talion Whereupon this day came the ^d Plaintiff who having proved his demand to be just it is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the said Defendant the above sum of £2. 15. 5¹/₂ and his costs by him in this behalf expended & it is ordered that the Sheriff sell the attached effects at public sale for ready money and therewith discharge the above judgment or so much thereof as the sales shall amount to & return an account of his proceedings hereon to the next Court

Joseph Scott having obtained an attachment against the estate of George Brewer who hath privately removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of Law cannot be served upon him James Ridley Gent Sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said Attachment in the hands of Joshua Whitney and summoned him as garnisher Whereupon this day came the said Plaintiff who having proved his demand to be just and the said Whitney appearing & declaring that he had sufficient in his hands to satisfy the judgment & costs it is considered that the ^d Plaintiff recover against the ^d Defendant Brewer the sum of four pounds three shillings & three pence & his costs by him in this behalf expended and that the ^d Whitney account with the Sheriff for the money in his hands & that the ^d Sheriff therewith discharge this judgment & costs & return an account of his proceedings to the next Court

An Indenture of feoffment from Thomas Porter of the one part to John Lister of the other part was acknowledged by the ^d Thomas and seems to be recorded

Russell Williamson who was appointed a constable at the last court appears according to his summons & having taken the usual oaths to his majesty person and government and took and subscribed the abjuration oath and test was sworn in his office

Ordered that the Sheriff summon twenty four of the most capable freeholders not being ordinary keepers constables surveyors of highways or owners or occupiers of mills to attend at the next Court ^{in the third of May} to serve as a grand jury of inquest on the body of this County
