

11 On the motion of Joseph Bradshaw and Nathan Council witnesses for Benjamin Woull at the suit of Thomas Gray: by Thomas Gray his father and next friend it is ordered that the said Woull pay the said Bradshaw fifty pounds of Tobacco for two days attendance on this Court & the said Nathan twenty five pounds of Tobacco for one day attendance on this Court according to Law

✓ On the motion of John Oney & Nathan Joiner witnesses for William Drake at the suit of John Bly it is ordered that the S. Drake pay them seventy five pounds of Tobacco each for three days attendance on this Court respectively according to Law

✓ Orders that Lewis Joiner be added to the persons hitherto appointed to appraise Elias Love's estate & that he being first sworn before a justice of the peace do (in) conjunction with those appointed before appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of the said Love & return the appraisement to Court

An Indenture of feoffment tripartite between the chief men of the Nottoway Indian Nation of the one part Joseph Gray William Taylor & Howell Edmunds of the second part and Miles Cary of the third part was proved by the oaths of said Kells Thomas Gray & William Simmons witnesses thereof ordered to be recorded

Orders that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning 10 o'clock
