

At a Court held for the county of Southampton the 10th day of July

An Indenture of feoffment between William Roe and Martha his wife of the one part and Francis Lowe of the other part was acknowledged by the said William Roe and ordered to be recorded

An Indenture of feoffment between Daniel Sebrell of the one part and Benjamin Sebrell of the other part was acknowledged by the said Daniel Sebrell and ordered to be recorded

Upon the complaint of Joseph Cobb against Simon Woodard for breach of the peace (to which complaint he was heretofore bound to appear) This day came the parties and the said Joseph having taken the oath of the peace It is ordered that the said Simon find security for the peace that is to say the said Simon in the sum of twenty pounds and his securities in ten pounds each Whereupon the said Simon together with Daniel Fisher & Ralph Carter his securities came into court and acknowledged themselves indebted to our sovereign lord the king that is to say the said Simon in the sum of twenty pounds and the said Daniel and Ralph his securities in ten pounds each of their respective lands & tenements goods and chattles to our said lord the king his heirs & successors rendered Yet upon this condition that if the said Simon shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour to all his majestys liege subjects for the space of twelve calendar months and particularly to the said Joseph Cobb then this recognizance be void

The last will and testament of John Bittle was presented in court by William Bittle the executor therein named and proved by the oaths of Henry Vaughan Joseph Delt jr. & William Bittle jr. the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said executor who made oath according to Law certificate was granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security Whereupon the said William Bittle with Henry Vaughan his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds for the due and faithful administration on the estate of the said deceased performance of his will

Ordered that William Kirby William Killigren David Camundus Joseph Delt and three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appear in current money the claims of any personal estate of John Bittle
